LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

CCC's Leadership Development Program (LDP) engages Jewish teens in grades 8–12 in meaningful and interactive community service. At our monthly sessions, we teach critical leadership skills and provide hands-on volunteer opportunities at CCC's community-outreach programs. With four locations around Atlanta, the 2024 cohort includes 296 teens.

Our LDP curriculum includes:

- Community-building & Jewish leadership
- Empathetic volunteering
- Fundraising skills
- Program planning & implementation
