Key Moments from our Year

Strategic Planning

In the first year of our strategic plan implementation, we focused on overall infrastructure. To respond to our community's interest in CCC's future growth, both in our teen Leadership Development Program (LDP) and in our community outreach work, a top priority of the plan is ensuring effective processes and operating functionality.

October 7, 2023

When the events of Oct. 7 unfolded, CCC had just launched our Fall Fundraiser, led entirely by the teens in our Leadership Development Program. We grappled with whether to cancel the fundraiser, knowing that our community's giving priorities were elsewhere. After pausing to listen to our teens and understand their needs, we realized most of them wanted to continue as planned.

They found power in their ability to come to a space with other like-minded Jewish teens, and they were inwardly motivated to continue showing the world, through service, what truly living their Jewish values means to them. We are so proud of our teens who so passionately represented CCC and raised \$85,446! We are tremendously grateful to the generous donors who supported their fundraising efforts, especially our Matching Grant Donors.

LDP Mentor Training Program

We completed the first full year of our LDP Mentor Training Program, designed to equip our 19 Jewish young adult mentors with educational tools and best practices to teach our curriculum and serve as role models for the 268 teens in our program. The training sessions also provide skill building and Jewish learning for our mentors as they develop their own identities as Jewish leaders.
